

CLUB POLICY # 113

Junior Club

1.0 It is the intent of the Board that the Club supports a Junior Club. The Junior Club will be composed of boys and girls between the ages of ten to twenty years of age. Such members in the Junior Club will have no voting rights in the corporation.

2.0 At present, the junior club is being supervised by **volunteer members of Gateway Rifle & Pistol Club. *There is no longer any affiliation with the 4 H Club of America.***

3.0 Range use by the Junior Club will be under the following conditions:

3.1 Organized activity requiring full or partial use of Club facilities must have prior permission from the Board. These periods of range use will be planned in advance by the Board and so noted on the Club's official schedule calendar. The Junior Club will have exclusive use of whatever range or facility granted in advance by the Board. The adult instructors will, in general, supervise the Junior Club's activity and operation. However, the Board's policies on targets and safety, for example, will override and govern all activity.

3.2 Outdoor range use by Junior Club members as individuals or at any time other than the above described organized and approved time periods may occur as follows:

3.2.1 Junior Club members may, when accompanied and supervised by their adult Gateway Club member parents, use the Club facilities.

3.2.2 Junior members, whose parents are not Gateway Club members, may use Club facilities as individuals provided that the junior member is directly supervised by an adult instructor from the Junior Club. Such junior members will not pay daily range or membership fees. However, their use of the range will be first come, first served. The adult instructor will have to coordinate the junior member's range use with whatever other Club members are on the range at the time. Specifically, the Junior Club instructors cannot simply "take over" a range for the Junior Club's individual members to shoot except in paragraph 3.1. above.

4.0 Funding for the Junior Club: Monies raised by matches sponsored by the Junior Club and proceeds from the Concealed weapons Carry Permit classes conducted by Junior Club leadership will, effective 14 February, 2011, will be split as follows: 70% of the profit (total proceeds less cost of event) will be entered into the Junior Club account at GRPC and 30% will be given to the GRPC general income fund. Any payments made to juniors for match assistance, i.e. target setting will be remanded to the GRPC Junior Club fund.
